NEPHI'S ACCOUNT OF THE ISRAELITES' ENTERING THE LAND (1 Nephi 17:32-35,40,41)

- A v32 And after they had crossed the river Jordan
- B he did make them mighty
- C unto the driving out of the children of the land,
- D yea, unto the scattering them to destruction.
- E v33 And now, *do ye suppose*
- F that the children of this land, who were in the land of promise, who were driven out by our fathers,
- G do ye suppose that they were righteous?
- H Behold, I say unto you, *Nay*.
- I v34 Do ye suppose that *our fathers would have been more choice than they* if they had been righteous?
I say unto you, *Nay*.
v35 Behold, the Lord esteemeth all flesh in one; he that is righteous is favored of God.

MOSES' PROPHECY OF THE ISRAELITES' ENTERING THE LAND (Deuteronomy 9:1-7)

- v1 Hear, O Israel: Thou art to pass over Jordan this day,
- to go in to possess nations greater and mightier than thyself, cities great and fenced up to heaven,
- v2 A people great and tall, the children of the Anakims, whom thou knowest, and of whom thou hast heard say, Who can stand before the children of Anak!
- v3 Understand therefore this day, that the LORD thy God is he which goeth over before thee; *as a consuming fire* he shall destroy them, and he shall bring them down before thy face:
- so shalt thou drive them out,
- and destroy them quickly, as the LORD hath said unto thee.
- v4 *Speak not thou in thine heart*,
- after that the LORD thy God hath cast them out from before thee,
- saying, For my righteousness the LORD hath brought me in to possess this land:
- but for* the wickedness of these nations the LORD doth drive them out from before thee.
- v5 *Not for thy righteousness*, or for the uprightness of thine heart, dost thou go to possess their land: [See Deut. 10:17 "For the Lord your God is God of gods, and Lord of lords, a great God, a mighty, and a terrible, which *regardeth not persons*, nor taketh reward."]
